THE COURSE CONTENT

Heelwork can be a drag. Let's face it some dogs and handlers look as interesting as paint drying – while the poor dog must be bored to tears with stuffy, stilted heelwork. Rigid bodies and “obedience” hand signals reduce the impact and visual attractiveness of a routine.

Heelwork can however be wonderful – dynamic, lively, interesting, with the dog engaged and interested AND their handler strutting their stuff and entertaining the audience.

Nobody does stylish, interesting heelwork like Ann de Rizzio. Famous for her relaxed style and interesting routines, Ann's dogs loose nothing of their precision in their heelwork. Ann's track record at Crufts and other major events speaks for itself.

So why not come along and learn how to make your heelwork routines inspiring for you, your dog – and lets not forget the very important audience (oops and of course the judges).

Directions to the venue
